

Regarding Conversations on the HF Bands

The points President Jerry Aceto, K6LIE made about the lack of conversations on the HF bands in the *Bosque Beacon (September 2023, page 6)* are sadly, all too true. I remember fondly a Sunday schedule I had with a fellow Ham in Indonesia during the early 1980s with whom we had similar interests.

There are solutions to this issue and interestingly, ham radio provides them. Perhaps we should consider communicating using some of the Keyboard to Keyboard digital modes to carry out *real* conversations.

Recent exchanges that I have had, greatly enhanced my own ham radio experience. An Australian Science teacher working in a mission school in the Philippines shared STEM projects he was working on. I gave him some links to Web Quests (*Internet Based Projects*) I had used.

With the America's Cup Sailing event taking place, I chatted keyboard to keyboard with a fellow sailor in New Zealand about the event. Having grown up in Mamaroneck, NY where some America Cup yachts were built got me interested in sailing and racing. My wife and I raced *Sonars*, a class racer, for years.

Digital Modes like *JS8*, and *VarAC* offer the robustness and error free operations of FT8 while allowing a more meaningful exchange and a real conversation.

If you operate FT8, you already have the equipment for these digital modes.

2 METER/70 CM DUAL BAND ANTENNA

Dual Band Roll-Up J-Pole Antenna for EmComm

General:

The Roll-Up J-Pole is generally considered to be the preferred dual band gain antenna for EmComm Go Kit use. They are durable, compact and easy to deploy. The design described herein is a dual band – VHF/UHF 2M/70cm antenna. This antenna will provide a gain of between 3-5DBi with a SWR of 1.5 or less across the band.

Material:

Twin lead is the most common transmission line used in building a roll-up J-Pole. This antenna is constructed using common 300Ω TV twin lead. The conductors should be stranded to provide for easy roll-up and storage and with less 'memory' to hang vertically when deployed.

Deployment:


The antenna may be suspended from any non-metallic support. A similar roll-up antenna can be deployed mounted in a pvc pipe for a more permanent installation. The dimensions for an antenna mounted in this manner are slightly different than those below. Consult the internet for the required dimensional changes.

Choke Balun:

When deployed it is prudent to install a choke type balun to reduce rf current from traveling back down the coax to your radio. This can be accomplished by adding several ferrite beads to the coax covered by heat shrink tubing or by creating an 'air' choke by creating a three turn (3" dia) coil of coax. Either type choke should be installed within 6" of the antenna termination.

Materials:

A limited number of 'kits' will be available at the build session. The kit contains, 1 ea 5' section of twin lead, 10' of coax (RG-174 or RG-58), 1 each coax crimp connector (BNC(M) or SMA(M)), ty-wraps and heat shrink. The cost of the kit is \$4.00 each. Limit of one kit per attendee.
