This affords a good learning experience on conducting a net and engaging in conversation.

CLUB REPEATER 444.200 Mhz (+) 67 Hz PL

A reminder to all that our club repeater is up and running from the west area of Rio Rancho at an elevation of about 700 feet above the valley, affording very good coverage of the greater Albuquerque area.

The repeater has been very quiet since getting it on the air several months ago. We would like to see it used by our members and also the entire community. It is open to all. You all are welcome to meet on our system. You can chat all you want and meet with your friends and club members. Please give it a try and you can chat all day long, if you wish!!

Coverage is approximately Los Lunas to the Santa Fe area. The majority of the Rio Grande valley is well covered. The north end of Rio Rancho and Bernalillo near highway 550 have some rough spots but is still usable.

Much work has gone into providing the club with a repeater. Please take a little time to use it with other members.

HamClock

The picture to the right sure looks like a Geochron clock, but the HamClock is so much more. I ran across this software and discovered it is so much more than a clock. Why they named this software HamClock is beyond me since it does so much more. In reality, this actually is a propagation software to aid hams in predicting the probability of



what area of the world you can work at a given time in real time. I will demonstrate where bands are open. It will tell you the number of sunspots (the panel on the display that shows 172) is the sunspot number present when I took this picture of my 27 inch monitor. It shows the gray line, solar flux, K index, solar wind, solar x-ray number. It shows DX clusters, on air stations, such as POTA. I could go on since I only scratched the surface as to what this program can do. The best part is that it is free software!!

I am really looking forward to demonstrating this software at our February meeting. If you work HF, EME, Satellites, or want to see where the Aurora displays are and at what probability they will appear, this program is a must have. And it all is running on a Raspberry Pi Zero 2 W that fits in the palm of your hand. The computer runs \$15, or you can by a kit with the computer, power supply, case, HDMI cable...everything you need for about \$43 from Amazon, including shipping. The only thing the kit does not have is a micro-sd card.

I think you all will be amazed at all the information this system can contribute to your everyday operating.

BTW...That snazzy club logo on the shirt and on our club banner was designed by Art Nichols, KI5GOL, one of our founding members.






