CLUB NET

Our club net has been doing very well and we want to thank all of you that participate each week. Anyone wishing to be net control, simply let a club officer know and you will be set up with the script and instruction page on linking the repeaters on the Upper Rio repeater system. This affords a good learning experience on conducting a net and engaging in conversation.

Remember, club net every Saturday morning at 10 am (except the 1st Saturday for our meeting) on the Upper Rio Repeater system.

CLUB REPEATER 444.200 Mhz (+) 67 Hz PL

A reminder to all that our club repeater is up and running from the west area of Rio Rancho at an elevation of about 700 feet above the valley, affording reasonable coverage of the greater Albuquerque area.

The repeater has been very quiet since getting it on the air a few months ago. We would like to see it used by our members and also the entire community. It is open to all. You all are welcome to meet on our system. You can chat all you want and meet with your friends and club members. Since it is a low level system, handhelds may have a problem, but in actuality, we have heard several folks on handhelds. But the ideal system is a typical mobile or fixed station running 20 watts or so to an outside antenna. In this situation, the system is very usable and does well. Please give it a try and you can chat all day long, if you wish!!

DECEMBER PROGRAM

What are the two most talked about subjects in Amateur Radio--Antennas and propagation, of course. Bill Mader, K8TE, will provide some insight into HF Propagation at our meeting Saturday. He'll dispel some of the hype that floats about along with some of the misinformation to better help us understand how the ionosphere impacts HF operations. He'll also point us toward good sources of information on how to use all the data readily available to us to pick the right bands for our skeds, chasing DX, or just when to be on the air. Bill will also provide hints on dispelling the hype and myths so we can become more knowledgeable and helpful mentors on this most discussed and so poorly understood topic.



As you can see in the picture, it consists of a 12 volt battery, a 120 volt, 300 watt sinewave inverter and a voltage and current monitoring system. It also has a built in solar option with controller.

They have classes 3x per year based on state funding

They have an ARES trailer that they take out when needed. This group works with Rio Rancho only. Accountability is what controls the gathering of different groups to deploy where. The first entry point to the live Cert class is the online testing. If you pass this class then you can be on the list to get into the class. They have 125 active members, ~300 total members. The next live course is in January 2025. they have about 25-30 people in the each class.

They have monthly trainings on how to help in live situations. The limitations you may have physically is really on how comfortable that you think you may be in a given situation.

ARES does the Comms for the CERT Team. FEMA has an independent set of courses. You do get a really cool green special CERT backpack when you pass the class course. But you can still buy these if you wish on your own.

Bill Kent - Club radio is now in our hands - the Yaesu FT-710 100W HF radio.

We now have a safe travel box for it.

What's next for the club radio setup? Power, battery, solar, converter, generator, meters?

The club had lots of discussion on batteries. A motion was made to ascertain what battery is best and cost to plan on.
